a note from Sarah

Dear Friend,

As I write this letter, I do so with a deep sense of gratitude, knowing it will be my last as Kids FIRST's Executive Director. After 13 fulfilling years with this incredible organization, I have made the personal decision to step down and spend more time with my daughter. While this is a big change, I am excited for the opportunity to remain with Kids FIRST in a new role as Managing Director. In this position, I will continue to support our incredible team and work alongside the incoming Executive Director to advance the mission we have all worked so hard to build.

Reflecting on this past year, I am filled with appreciation for the remarkable journey we have shared. Your unwavering support has been instrumental in helping us achieve so much. Our monthly giving program, KF Circle, has grown to over 50 members who, together, donated more than \$10,000 this year. In July, KF Winetasia—our largest fundraiser—raised over \$80,000, setting a new fundraising milestone for Kids FIRST. Together, we are creating a stronger and safer community for children and families.

This year, we also expanded our impact through education and training. Kids FIRST conducted a record number of training sessions, reaching over 600 community members and partners with essential information on preventing, recognizing, and responding to child abuse. Highlights include Stewards of Children, an evidence-based child sexual abuse prevention program, and our tailored Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse training for mandatory reporters. Our Multidisciplinary Team received advanced training on critical topics like child exploitation, sex trafficking, and investigating unexplained child injuries, ensuring that every child receives the comprehensive care they need. While these subjects are difficult, they underscore the vital work being done every day to protect our children.

In addition to these efforts, we are leading by example in sustainability. This year, we were honored to receive the Rethink Business Certification from BRING Recycling, demonstrating our commitment to green and sustainable practices. We firmly believe that caring for our environment is an essential part of caring for our community.

As I reflect on the past seven years serving as Executive Director, I am deeply proud of all that we have accomplished together, and I am confident the next chapter will bring even more growth, innovation, and positive change.

All of us at Kids FIRST are incredibly thankful for your partnership and support. Together, we will continue to help children heal, grow, and thrive.



Mental Health Program Updates

Our mental health program, launched in 2022, continues to help children heal and thrive after their initial assessment at Kids FIRST. This program ensures ongoing care and stability is available to **empower children** on their journey to recovery.



405 mental health screenings administered

78 children received therapy services

329 therapy sessions provided

12 average age of client



The approximate cost of therapy services for one child is \$1,200



Due to limited insurance reimbursement—and our commitment to offering services **at no cost to children and families**—our therapy program remains one of our most underfunded areas. This ongoing need highlights the importance of community support as we expand our services to meet the needs of Lane County.





While we don't charge families for services, we do bill insurance to help cover the cost. This year, 90% of our program service revenue came from Medicaid, 7% from private insurance providers, and 3% from Crime Victims Compensation.
